DECEMBER MEETING

The December meeting will feature an exhibition of member photos, a fundraiser raffle, a critique by an outside judge of the month's "Best Of" image competition, and dessert and coffee. Because this meeting is geared especially toward members attending in person, the only part of the meeting that will be open for viewing via Zoom will be the comment session by the quest judge. Members are requested to bring a dessert item that will serve 6-8; coffee will be provided. Please be sure to come whether or not you are able to bring anything to eat. Spouses are welcome.

J.R. Schnelzer, a past president of LPS and current president of the Photographic Society of America, will be emceeing the festivities.

For the raffle, tickets will be sold at the meeting for \$1 each or 12 for \$10, accepting cash or checks made out to Loveland Photographic Society. During the evening, ticket holders will place their tickets in bowls next to the various donated items; put all of your tickets in one bowl or distribute them to multiple choices. At the end of the meeting, drawings will be held for each raffle item: the holder of the selected ticket wins the item. Ticket sale proceeds will go to the club; unsold items will be returned to the donor or taken to ARC. The raffle is open to members and non-members.

Hearing in-person comments by a highly qualified guest judge is both an interesting and helpful opportunity, as the LPS judges during the year seldom have time to write comments on all of our monthly competition images. Although the competition photos at the December meeting have already been scored during the year, this also demonstrates a different perspective offered by a different judge.

Submitting Pictures for the Monthly Competition or Photo Review Session

- · Log on to the LPS website
- Mouse over the Competitions dropdown on the Home Page.
- Select menu item:

Submit images to a Competition

- Select the Competition category or the Third Monday Photo Review
- At the bottom of the screen, click on Upload images into the Competition.
- Then click on the button Select which will open a window on your computer to select an image.
- Click on Save Images and Proceed to Edit Page.
- Type in a title and click on Save any changes and return to original page.
- You can replace any photo, up to the submission deadline, if desired.

The monthly competitions allow a single image per category. The photo review session allows up to three images.

Member Print Exhibition

- Only members may participate; each member may submit up to 2 prints. Dues must be paid by 12/3.
- Prints should be no smaller than 8x10; any medium accepted.
- Members submitting large framed images are encouraged to bring a display easel.
- Pre-registration for the exhibition required, no later than December 4, at: ardeth.carlson@gmail.com
- For the display, provide a 4x6 label with your name and image title; can include address of your photography website
- Bring prints to the church between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Monday, December 11.

LPS Raffle

- Donated items can be tangible, such as a framed print, camera bag, photography book, handicraft, or home decoration, or intangible, such as an hour of mentoring, a one-day photo shoot, or a painting class. (These are just examples.) The item does not have to be photography-related.
- Bring raffle items to the church between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Monday, December 11.

New Eyes for Photo Editing

At recent meetings, members voiced that they wanted more hands-on experiences through LPS. An opportunity for trying out your photo editing skills and learning from others will come in January, February, and March.

To get us started:

From December 4 through January 4, members are invited to submit 1 or 2 <u>unedited</u> photos that have a lot of potential for editing. To submit the photos, go to the LPS website, under Competitions>Submit Images to a Competition, and select the #1 New Eyes folder. Submit your JPEG photo or photos as you usually do, with the image title as name_title.jpg. (For example: Sprain_My Garden.jpg.)

A committee will look at all the submitted photos to choose about 6 photos for members to edit. The committee is looking for photos that are the most rewarding for others to edit that are in a variety of genres (landscape, portrait, architecture, etc.). Photos that are not selected will be saved for future editing sessions.

In January:

The 6 selected photos will be put into a One Drive account. The January LPS newsletter will include the link to the One Drive account where you can download any or all of the photos for editing.

Each member can edit and revise the images in any way you choose. Be as realistic or creative with the images as you want by trying out new techniques.

Each member is allowed to submit 1 to 3 edited images by February 5 on the LPS website, under Competitions>Submit Images to a Competition, and select the #2 New Eyes Edited folder.

At the February LPS meeting on February 12: All the edited images submitted by members will be shown for the February program. The presentation time will include comments about editing and group discussion.

At the March LPS meeting on March 11:

Several experienced LPS members will explain and demonstrate their editing of photos.

Hope you join the editing experience by submitting your photos and trying your hand at editing.

This involves trying to find speakers who have the availability to attend a meeting and are willing to do so for a small honorarium of \$50 and which include topics the committee hopes will be of interest to LPS members.

Before the Covid pandemic, meetings were only held in person, but the use of Zoom to provide attendance online has continued after health restrictions were lifted. This has made it possible for speakers to make their presentations online and has eliminated the necessity for them to be able to come to a meeting in person. It has also meant that in cases where the presentation is a webinar, our members don't have the opportunity to ask questions or interact with the speaker.

Much interest has been expressed for having hands-on activities at some of our monthly meetings. During discussion at the October meeting, suggestions included doing setups at meetings for macro, still life, portraiture/portrait lighting, and street photography. In order to carry out these ideas, it is necessary to have volunteers who can help set up and guide an activity. Please keep the judging criteria in mind: Impact and Viewer Interest—"Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops." This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image.

Composition—Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

Technical Quality—This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, or selective focus.

Monthly Topics—The subject matter should be related in some manner to the topic. While there are no formal deductions or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with the monthly topic. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.

Open Projected—The image must begin as a photograph. From there, it is up to you. Any photograph may be entered in the Open Projected category.

January Competition Groups

Participation in a group is determined by the average of the member's 9 previous LPS competition scores. Because the photos entered in the December "Best Of" competition have already been scored by LPS judges during the year's competitions, the scores given by the guest judge will not count in the score averages for January, so the groups for January have been determined by the averages after the November competition:

"The "Best Of" Competition

As is traditional, the photo competition for December features a "reprise" of images that have been submitted in LPS competitions during the year. Although these images have been judged by an LPS judging panel in the month in which they were entered, they will be scored separately by a guest judge.

The photo entered in the December competition must be the same one entered during the year and cannot be altered to make perceived "improvements" or changes based on the LPS judges' comments, if any. The photograph should be entered in the same category as previous, i.e. Open, Nature, or Travel. Photographs that were previously entered in a monthly topic or monochrome category should be entered in the Open category in December.

The judge will be able to view and score the entries prior to the December meeting and then will provide comments on each photo during the meeting. This is a prime opportunity for members to observe what experienced photography judges look for in an excellent image and for competing members to get feedback on their competition photographs.

The guest judge is being provided by the Photographic Society of America; more information about the guest judge will be posted on our Members Facebook page in the next few weeks.

Rich is collecting images for 2023-2024 now and would like images that show characteristic features of a place or a people. Image size should be a maximum of 1400x1050 pixels.

Interclub Photos Needed

The LPS reps for the PSA interclub competitions are asking for members to submit photos for round 2, which has a deadline of February 15. Their contact information is on this page. Since LPS is a member club of PSA, the photographers do not need to be individual members of PSA.

Photographers who have a photo submitted in a PSA interclub competition must have a signed release form on file. The signed release is valid for three years from the date of signature, after which a new signed release must be submitted to continue participating in interclub competitions. Members do not need to sign a separate release form for each of the divisions in which LPS participates; PSA maintains a list with the expiration date of participants. The signed release forms are obtained by the LPS reps, who will contact a member who submits a photo but does not have a current release.



Reasons to Join PSA

An individual membership in the Photographic Society of America is an excellent bargain for photographers seeking to improve their photography skills. PSA offers free online photography courses, study groups, mentorships, and the opportunity to compete individually in the PSA divisions of Nature, Travel, Pictorial Print, Projected Image, Photojournalism, and 3D. In addition, the monthly PSA Journal is available online for download. Educational webinars on a variety of subjects can be viewed at any time.

A new Colorado chapter of PSA has now been established. Most chapters meet several times during the year, and the meetings may be a few hours or day long, with a presenter, workshops, seminars, or photography outings. Chapter membership is available for those who are individual PSA members.

Youth Showcase

Saturday Photo Chat

The Saturday Photo Chat, formerly known as the "Bull Session," is an informal get-together of photographers to talk about places to photograph, gear, photo software, and almost anything about photography.

Third Monday Photo Review

An excellent way to get feedback on your photos and for experienced photographers to share their knowledge is to participate in the Monday Photo Review sessions, which occurs via Zoom on the third Monday of each month. Participants are allowed to submit three photos no later than noon of the session day. The review is mentored by Mike Wilcox, who welcomes and encourages comments and suggestions by all participants. Many members have reported that they have received a greater knowledge of photo techniques and also found it helpful to see their photos in the eyes of other photographers. Because judges of the monthly competition most often do not have time to offer critiques on all of the competition photos, the third Monday review provides that helpful aspect of improving our craft.
