
## Tips to Capture the Magic of Autumn

The autumn season is almost here and the urge to photograph the change of colors rises in almost anyone and it is a great opportunity to make excellent pictures. Autumn usually discloses nature at its loveliest. The light will also be crisp and clear that shows the vivid red and golden amber shades of the fading foliage. The resulting landscapes can be fiery or mellow.

The following are some suggestions to create outstanding images.

- Before shooting pictures think about a good composition. Move around to see the possibility of better perspective. Make use of composition techniques with the Rule of Thirds.
- On overcast days colors are more saturated and softer. If you have only one day to shoot and it's bright and sunny, look for backlight or side-light situations.
- The best landscape is when the 3-D effect can be obtained. Foreground is best when it is in focus.
- Do not overlook close-ups of foliage. Around water ponds or river banks you may find many outstanding opportunities. Leaves make fantastic detail images particularly when shot against a contrasting color.









- Explore the forest with your camera looking for interesting patterns and compositions created by trees, plants, and fungi that flourish on the forest floor. Look for mushrooms that have a magical, fairytale quality when in their natural environment.
- Fallen trees can make fascinating photographic subjects, their massive exposed and decaying roots creating a dramatic effect.
- Autumn is a busy time for many animals, as they prepare for winter. This creates an

- opportunity for images that are not only portraits of the animals themselves, but also show their relationship with their environment. Of course, wildlife doesn't appear on demand or pose on cue. However, spend a little time studying animals' habits and you'll increase your chances of success.
- It is not necessary to venture far from home to capture the beauty of autumn. Gardens,
   Parks and, yes, your home patio may offer to make outstanding autumn pictures.

#### September Theme — The "grunge" look Submission deadline:

Before Midnight, Tuesday, September 4, 2018 (Monday, September 3, is Labor Day, so we're bumping the deadline out to Tuesday)

#### Please keep the judging criteria in mind:

**Impact and Viewer Interest** — "Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops". This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image.

**Composition** — Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

**Technical Quality** — This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, selective focus, etc.

**Monthly Themes** — The subject matter should be related in some manner to the theme. While

there are no formal "deductions" or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with monthly theme. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.

#### 2018 Monthly Themes

October — Tombstones November — Jump shot December — "Best of..."
