Burrowing Owls and Birds in Flight

When I first contacted Rob he told me that he had been spending a lot of time recently photographing burrowing owls and wondered if there might be interest in that topic. If you visit his website, especially his Gallery on Owls http:// www.falconphotos.com/Galleries/Birds-of-Prey/Owls/Other-Owls/ you'll see why I jumped at the opportunity to schedule him as a presenter. In addition to being an outstanding photographer, since he's located in Boulder, there's a great chance he'll share some prime locations for nature photography. It's especially great to have someone with his expertise join us at the beginning of nesting season.

Rob has been involved with animals since he was very young. He has always had a passion for birds of prey, and has pursued that passion throughout his adult life. In college, he spent numerous hours studying the nesting territories of prairie falcons in Northeastern Colorado, and additional time researching screech owls nesting along the Boulder Creek trail in the center of Boulder, Colorado. Rob taught life science and biology for seven years in the late eighties and early nineties. Since that time, he has spent most of his free time studying raptors and refining his photography techniques.

Photography has always been a part of Rob's life. He began taking pictures with a Polaroid black and white camera when he was twelve, then guickly moved on to a 35 mm SLR. His first SLR was a Kowa. In high school he became the school's photographer and was able to use the school's Pentax cameras. The basics in photography have stuck with him.



Please keep the judging criteria in mind:

Impact and Viewer Interest — "Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops". This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image. **Composition** — Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

Technical Quality — This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, selective focus, etc.

Monthly Topics — The subject matter should be related in some manner to the topic. While there are no formal "deductions" or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with monthly topic. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.

Pricing Your Used Equipment for Sale

To determine a realistic price for your used equipment, do a little research on the internet to find the going rates for your equipment. Take into consideration the condition of the items you want to sell.

Check these resources for pricing ideas:

- Adorama
- ◆ B&H
- Cameta
- KEH
- eBay

You can check the trade-in value with camera stores, then see what their sales prices are. Somewhere in between these two numbers is probably a fair price.

You might start a little on the high side, but not completely out of the ballpark. You can always come down in price. My personal experience on eBay has shown that third party lenses in primo shape go for 59%-68% of their original value. Cameras don't do as well, since a newer model with more bells and whistles is probably already on the market. My old D90 went for 45% or its original value after the D7100 came out.

The LPS Website a Valuable Tool for Members

Our website has the potential to be an extremely valuable tool for our members both as a source of photographic information and as a means of intraclub communication. To date we have used a relatively small percentage of the tools available on our site so we are initiating an effort to capitalize on our website's full potential. With that in mind a subcommittee of interested members has begun the process of educating our members on website usage as well as reorganizing and enhancing our site to make it more user friendly.

As a first step, we'd suggest that all members go to our website, first without logging in, and then login. You will note there are significant differences in each instance. In the non-member view below very little

Information is available. Most significantly, if you click on **Membership** you'll note that **no information about individual members** is available to the public.

In the member view below if you click on **Membership** you can access information about members, find a link to **Personal Photographic Websites of Members** and a **Resources and Links** tab. Additionally, you will also see a heading **Discussion Forums**, a click on this tab gives you access to a wide variety of information.



As a first step to better utilization of the website we'd encourage all members to make their email available to other members. You can accomplish the by clicking on the My Account tab above, click on Account Settings, Update Personal Profile and Organization Options, and then scroll down and check the box Allow other members to view my contact information.


If you choose to do this another member can email you by simply searching your name and clicking on your email address. This will facilitate the email interchange between individual members that many people have requested. Remember, non-members do not have access to this information.

If you would like to add your Personal Photographic Website to that link under **Membership**, simply send an email with the link to your website to Rich Bilancia and your link will be included. Please remember, this is for Photographic websites, not for business postings or other interests.

Finally, for this initial article, we'd like to focus on **Discussion Forums** which should become a very powerful tool for our members. If you click on that tab, you'll see all the forums currently available. A

partial list below provides examples of what is available. You can access these forums by clicking the **View Topics** box or if you really want easy access you can click on **Subscribe** and you'll receive an email anytime there is a new posting in the forum. Each forum functions independently so you can decide how you'd like to follow each topic. Remember only members have access to **Discussion Forums** so a level of security is established which is particularly important for events like fieldtrips and meet and shoots.

This is just the beginning of our efforts to better utilize our website. It's a work in progress and we'll keep you apprised of other enhancements as they are developed. If you have suggestions for improvements, feel free to share them with board members or post them in **Discussion Forums** under **General discussions.** In any event, take some time to explore our website, we hope you'll find it to be a very useful membership tool.

April Field Trip: Architecture Photography

The LPS April field trip on Saturday, April 29 will focus on architecture photography as we travel to the annual "Doors Open Denver" event sponsored by the Denver Architectural Foundation. Almost 70 sites across the city will be open to explore and photograph. Although our primary focus will be individual structures, this outing could also be considered an "urban landscape" shoot.

Our plan is to meet-up at 8 am at the I-25-US 34 park-and-ride on Saturday, April 29th and carpool to the Denver Union Station, headquarters for Doors Open Denver. Members of the Ft. Collins Digital Camera Club have also been invited to join this outing.

Tentative itinerary:

After a brief period of photographing around Union Station, we will visit the nearby DaVita World Headquarters (new to DOD this year), a 14-story Neo-modern-type structure completed in 2012 with the largest rooftop terrace in downtown Denver. The adjacent 1900 Sixteenth building and Millennium bridge will offer additional photographic opportunities. Next we will visit the Blair Caldwell African American Library, largest branch library in the Denver Public Library system and a contemporary structure modeled after the Pazzi Chapel in Florence. Then we will look for interesting reflection opportunities by visiting the 1999 Broadway building, a 46-story skyscraper designed by Fentress Architects to include the historic Holy Ghost Catholic Church at its base. Other tentative sites to visit are the Denver Central Public Library, the Clifford Still Museum and several historic homes in the Capital Hill neighborhood. We'll plan on having lunch somewhere along the 16th Street Mall area. Also, we hope to use downtown buses to travel between sites, or else use our cars. Note that the



above itinerary can be adjusted to other sites depending on attendees' interests or suggestions.
