

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Bob and his wife Cindy, an experienced naturalist, worked for two years to produce a gorgeous book of text and photography in a visually stunning format. The book was a labor of love, the conditions under which the shooting took place were sometimes brutal, including temperatures ranging from +120 to -12 degrees Fahrenheit, wind, snow and a lot of hiking in the dark. Many of the locations had to be visited multiple times to get the right night sky conditions. Years-long exchanges with the Bureau of Land Management over the right to do night photography on Federal land culminated with new rules enacted in 2016 making it illegal to place lights on, against, or in ruins. All of the images in the book that are subject to this rule were shot before this rule went in effect. Those images can now no longer be legally re-staged. As a consequence, we will see images in Bob's presentation that can never be recreated. Bob will have copies of Ancient Skies Through Ancient **Eves** available at our meeting.

This is a meeting you won't want to miss. As always, you are encouraged to visit Bob's website in anticipation of his presentation. In addition to his impressive photo gallery and information about *Ancient Skies Through Ancient Eyes* he has a number of upcoming photo tours that may pique your interest.

Lines for Interest and Unity

In photography, the simple possible way to make a picture attractive is through the use lines effectively. The main importance of lines is that the eye follows them and direct the attention to the center of interest whether it's a subject, or a vanishing point in the background.

Leading lines, such as roads and streams, should begin at lower left of the frame and take the eye to a point of interest, not out. The subject should be off the center. (Picture 1) The natural movement of the eye is from left to the right.

The eye, incidentally, follows light rather than dark, unless it is a dark line surrounded by light. In this case the eye follows the dark line.

The use of an object(s) as leading lines it provides a way into the picture and to the center of interest. It's another simple and easy path for the eye to follow to the main subject. (Picture 2)

Path lines tends to lead the eye to a vanishing point in the distance. (Picture 3)

Some photographers may be deviating from some of the above lines concepts for slightly different modes of expression or composition. But, it is very helpful to know the principles of composition before deviating from them logically and successfully.

November: Golden hour — rays and shadows

December: "Best of ..." — Enter any previously submitted images in a 2017 competition. They do not need to have won an award, but must be in their original edit version. The best way to do this is to select the image from your gallery.

Please keep the judging criteria in mind:

Impact and Viewer Interest — "Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops". This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image. **Composition** — Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

Technical Quality — This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, selective focus, etc.

Monthly Topics — The subject matter should be related in some manner to the topic. While there are no formal "deductions" or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with monthly topic. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.
