July Program: 10 Things You Didn't Know About Photography

his past winter, Octavio Noda, Dave Van Riper, Jim Digby, and I decided to attend a presentation on the History of Photography at the Loveland Museum. The presenter was Micah Messenheimer an Assistant Curator at the Denver Art Museum, I can't speak for everyone, but I really wasn't expecting to learn anything new since I considered myself well read on the subject and had attended any number of exhibits of early photographic work by the likes of Mathew Brady and Louis Daguerre. Additionally, like many of you, I was a veteran of pinhole camera experiments in grade school, and had some darkroom experience from the pre digital days of photography. As Micah began his presentation, I was confident that I'd experience a pleasant rehashing of my vast knowledge of photographic history. Again, I can't speak for the other guys, but I was certainly surprised and humbled by my actual lack of knowledge. Who knew that Aristotle was familiar with the principals of the Camera Obscura or that artists like the Dutch Masters used that technique to create the detail in their paintings. While I knew there was a link between astronomy and photography I had no idea it went back hundreds of years and that the Camera Obscura was described by Roger Bacon, in 13th century England, as a safe way

to view solar eclipses. After his presentation, I was convinced that Micah needed to share his knowledge with our club and was delighted when he agreed to speak at our July meeting.

So, for this month's program, I'd suggest you free yourself from any preconceived notions you have about Photographic History. I'll predict you will learn a great deal from Micah's Program, in fact, mirroring the History Channel, the program could easily be titled "10 Things You Don't Know About Photography".






