Photographing Texture

Texture is one of the most fundamental elements of three-dimensional art. Texture adds a strong sense of realism to photographs, because it appeals directly to our sense of touch. Texture reveals the nature of a surface.

Finding simple textures is very easy. They are all around us, they can be a flower, rocks in the ground, a surface of a door or many other subjects. Finding unique, beautiful and eyecatching textures is necessary to start looking for patterns and textures and soon you will start noticing textures that are more unique and beautiful than others and you will soon get a feeling of what is going to look good in a photograph.


Take a look at the six sample pictures included in this article. Each one does have different types of texture, but are unique in their contents.

In landscape late afternoon side light accentuates the surface characteristics with better details than any other sources of light. In close up an even illumination is very important. Texture, although usually best revealed in close-ups can also dramatically can be conveyed in more distant subjects, like shown in the Lincoln statue.


In order to get everything in focus a lens aperture of f/8 or more is necessary. A high aperture number means slow shutter speed and the potential of camera shake. Consequently, a tripod is necessary and to avoid any possibility of camera move use a cable release. In almost all cases, using a built-in pop-up flash is not desirable, as it will ruin the texture by introducing a flat-looking direct, harsh light that will have a negative effect in the shadows. Ambient light is the best. Avoid using wide-angle lenses they might introduced distortion if your photographing straight lines.

November: Golden hour — rays and shadows

Submission deadline:

Monday, November 6, 2017, 11:59 P.M.

December: "Best of ..." — Enter any previously submitted images in a 2017 competition. They do not need to have won an award, but must be in their original edit version. The best way to do this is to select the image from your gallery.

Please keep the judging criteria in mind:

Impact and Viewer Interest — "Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops". This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image.

Composition — Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

Technical Quality — This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is

also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, selective focus, etc.

Monthly Themes — The subject matter should be related in some manner to the topic. While there are no formal "deductions" or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with monthly topic. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.

Oh what fun it is to take a fisheve and ultra wide angle lens to the Clive Cussler Museum in Arvada, Colorado.

Sixty of his 100 cars are on display at any one time, with enough light for photo enthusiasts to capture their favorites without a flash. Every car has been restored to brand-new-looking condition.

One of the areas includes cars from the 1950's, some with fins, wrap-around windshields. and continental kits. You'll see Pontiac, Oldsmobile, Buick, Cadillac, Chrysler, Imperial and Studebaker among others.

Classic automobiles right from the pages of Cussler's books are also included. Some of them have a copy of the book associated with that car on display as well.

Another section of the museum displays really old cars, such as...

1911 Locomobile

Stanley Steamer

1908 Cadillac

The collection also features a gas pump that is set for 25-9/10 cents per gallon, back when they pumped it for you while washing your windshield.

Thanks to the Loveland Photographic Society; I wouldn't have known about Cussler's museum if it wasn't brought up as a field trip. If you are interested in going, check the hours — they are not open during the winter months or to the public on weekends.
