The following information is being presented in order to determine who has an interest in attending this very special field trip. If there is a large interest then there may be a limit to the number of participants able to attend, and your response will help us to determine if there needs to be limits placed on the number of people that can be accommodated. Please read the following information carefully before you respond.



As a brief background of the area for those who have never been there, the wilderness covers approximately 60 square miles, 35 plus miles south of

Farmington, New Mexico. It features steeply eroded hills, and some of the most unique and unusual formations in the Southwest. It once was a coastal swamp of an inland sea and was home to large trees, reptiles and primitive mammals. What you will see today is this preserved record of that original swamp.

There are <u>NO</u> facilities, grass, trees or toilets at the site, but camping is permitted at both the North entrance and South entrance, with no services. This is BLM land which intersects with Navajo lands. You must bring everything with you. Many of the participants will likely stay in Farmington at one of the many motels, which you will need to make arrangements for, and drive the 35+ miles to reach the site. Others may choose to camp at the locations.

Here is the tentative plan, so that you may determine if this field trip is of interest. This is **NOT** an

official sign-up, just a show of interest!

The trip will begin at approximately 6:00 on the evening of May 13, 2016. It takes approximately 7 hours to drive to Farmington from our location and another 45-50 to the North entrance. The plan is to photograph the formations

(approximately ³/₄ mile walk) with the setting sun, scheduled for 8:12 pm. Then for those who would like to stay and photograph the stars, weather permitting this could go on until late in the evening.

The next morning, Saturday May 14, 2016 we will meet at the South Parking lot at 5 am, to hike to the "Cracked Eggs" formation (approximately 1 mile each way) to capture the morning light. After that we will explore the area around these formations, and discover many wonderful photographic opportunities. Evening is up to you, and you may want to photograph the setting sun from another location.

Sunday morning we will meet again this time at the North parking lot at 5:30 am to repeat the early light on the "Moore Garden" feature and many others. After that you may want to head home or continue to explore the northern reaches of the wilderness.

For those who have the time and interest, there is a continuation of the this trip scheduled for Monday, where we will explore the area around Shiprock for unique locations to photograph from. For those who can extend their stay we will plan on also photographing at Chaco Canyon, Angel Peak and the ruins in and around Farmington. These trips can be self-guided or in smaller groups which can be



planned while having diner in Farmington.

So if this is of **Serious** interest to you please let Ken Eis for the FCDCC, or JR Schnelzer for LPS know of your interest (see below). There will be more information to follow once a roster is developed, including equipment, what to take, what to wear, etc. You can expect that we will walk 1-4

miles a day with temperatures between 25 degrees and 75 degrees. If you have further questions please contact Ken or JR and also let them know if you are interested and if you plan to camp or stay in Farmington.

Competition Corner

This month's special topic is:

Subject isolation by tone or color — Isolating the subject by either tone, color, lighting, staging or post processing adjustment.

There are many ways to isolate the main subject of a photograph:

- DOF, (blurred background, foreground or both)
- Distance, making the subject loom large by shooting close or shooting the subject from a distance against a bare landscape

One of the most common ways to isolate the subject is with tone or color. Tone refers to the relative lightness or darkness of the subject from black to white regardless of color and color refers to separation by color complimentary or not.

Here are some examples:

Notice that in the case of the leaf, DOF also is used but the primary isolation of the leaf is by color and tone.

What will the judges be looking for?

Strong well isolated subjects where the key to the isolation is a significant separation by either tone, color or both.
