January Theme — White on white Submission deadline: Midnight, January 1, 2018

Please keep the judging criteria in mind:

Impact and Viewer Interest — "Wow" factor is the nebulous quality where an image "pops". This subjective aspect of judging should not preempt the technical or composition aspects of an image.

Composition — Good composition is a pleasing arrangement of the elements in an image. There are many guidelines for good composition that judges may consider.

Technical Quality — This includes sharpness, focus, color, tonal scale, contrast, appropriate depth of field and other qualities. Consideration is also given for the effect the photographer was trying to achieve such as high key, multiple exposure, selective focus, etc.

Monthly Themes — The subject matter should be related in some manner to the theme. While there are no formal "deductions" or penalties, judges may reduce their overall score if they feel the image does not align with monthly topic. With that said, creative interpretation is encouraged.

Go for Impact to Produce Winning Pictures

Every photography tells a story... only some do it better than others. From the simplest snapshot to the classic formal photograph all of them communicate something.

But, what is it that makes some pictures more impressive than others? Why is it that several pictures people have taken the same scene, yet one photography may stand above the rest?

The secret ingredient can be summarized in one word: IMPACT!

So, 1) What is impact?

2) How do you achieve it?

There's no universal definition of "impact" as applied to photography, but photographers and judges alike probably would characterize it as that quality in a picture that instantaneously captures the viewer's attention, excites his imagination, and presents the subject in a new and creative manner.

There's no universal formula for achieving impact in photographs. Some people are naturals to produce attention-getting results. Others must work at it and exercise a variety of techniques to accomplish it. The following are some aspects to make a winning picture: The precise time. Probably the most important factor in producing impact is a quick combination of eye, mind, imagination, camera ready, and a shutter finger.

Camera angle. Looking at things from unique perspective and the camera angle are the key factors to create that distinctive picture. It's amazing what bending your knees can do to a picture!

Close cropping. Framing a picture decorously will enhance the scene view.

Composition. Simply put, arranging the visual elements harmoniously. There are numerous approaches to achieve a sense of unity within a picture but mainly the elements should be arranged and balanced aesthetically so they are pleasing to the eye

Simplify. Avoid to include too much information into a photograph. There should be a center of interest or focus in the image.

Keeping in mind the above your picture could be a winner.
