Competition Corner

Third Monday Photo Review at the Library (Next: March 21st, 7:00 PM) has become so popular that we need to find a way to load the images ahead of time to stay within two hours. We also need to keep the number of images to three each. We have addressed both issues by setting up a process where you can load your images prior to attending by using the competition system. Beginning with March, you can load your images up to to 5 PM on the the 21st (and each 3rd Monday) by following the instructions below:

Submitting images to 3rd Monday Photo Review

We will now be submitting images to 3rd Monday Photo Review in the same way we enter them in a competition.

The showing and the process at 3rd Monday Photo Review will be the same as before but time will be saved by having the images loaded ahead of time. Make sure that all of your images are jpg and not greater than 4MB in size. If they are larger or not jpg, they will not load and you will receive an error message.

For those of you that have not entered images in competition, here is the process. You might print this email of and keep it handy for the first time.

Make sure you are logged on and mouse over the Competitions dropdown on the Home Page.

Select menu item: Submit images to a competition then select the competition with the title: Third Monday Photo Review and click the Select button on the Left side.

At the bottom of the screen, click on: Upload images into the competition. Then click on the button: Select which will open a window on your computer to select images.


You may select up to three images. This is slightly different than the normal process for the monthly competitions which only allows a single image per competition. You may also title the images. I would suggest you title them with the Letters A, B and C followed by your last name. That will allows us to limit to two images if necessary.

If you have difficulty, please call me and I will walk you through the process. If you aren't able to reach me you can still bring your images on a thumb drive.

The experienced photographers attending 3rd Monday that wish to bring examples, just bring them on a thumb drive, or email to me.

The topic for March is Architecture/City scenes

Not much to say about this. It pretty much must be a photograph of a building inside or out or other architectural structure or a city scene or detail of either or both. That's a pretty broad subject.

Anybody Shoot Mirrorless?

As an amateur among some very talented photographers, I have to ask -- is "mirrorless" a bad word? I do own a Nikon DSLR, but something bad happened when boarding a flight one day, that made me look for a smaller camera. On a full flight, they made me check my carry-on at the gate. I watched in horror as they tossed my bag out of the door way down to a conveyor belt -- with my camera inside.

My Olympus OMD-series camera and essential accessories (lenses, iPad, noise-reducing earphones, pills, etc.) all fit into a bag that goes under the seat in front of me. No worries now. They're not tossing my camera down to the pavement!

I really think the Nikon is more capable than the Oly, but not in my hands. It's easier for me to get good shots with the Oly. Both cameras shoot jpg+raw, and usually either camera can create a better jpg than I can by doctoring a raw file with Photoshop. But thanks to resources like LPS.CC my skills are improving. I have a long way to go with this hobby, but I'm enjoying the trip.

As a side note, if you're into in lightpainting as Dave Black introduced us to in February 2015, you might be interested to know about an Olympus feature known as live time, that can be accessed from manual mode. After setting the ISO and aperture, set the shutter to live time. When the shutter is released, the image "develops" right before your eyes and continues until the shutter is pressed once more. Reminds me of an image appearing in a tray of developer.
