She will share her specialization in taking photos in the high latitudes and altitudes of the Rocky Mountains and Alaska. Her photographs will feature travels to rustic locations and share the individual stories of the animals that she finds in mysterious and cold climates.

Dawn has been a full time professional wildlife photographer since 2013 but her passion for photography goes back, in her words, "forever". She has just become a full time traveling photographer, living in her RV, and traveling the USA to photograph and write about North American wildlife. Her amazing adventures are featured in a monthly travel column the she writes in the Fort Collins Coloradoan.

She moved to Colorado in 2002 and is originally from New Jersey. Dawn earned a BA in Communications from Rowan University, an MBA in marketing from Temple University, and studied photography and computer graphics at the Art Institute of Colorado and University of the Arts, respectively

Her work can be found in galleries and collections around North America.
